

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR WALK THROUGH THE BIBLE 01/04/12

1. Review 2 Corinthians 10:1-6. What does it mean to "take captives every though to make it obedient to Christ" (v. 5b)?
2. Paul concludes 2 Corinthians 13 with a Trinitarian blessing. Review the first, second, and third articles of the Apostles' Creed. For what blessings flowing from the grace of the of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of Holy Spirit are especially thankful today?
3. Paul writes to the Galatians, "If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a servant of Christ" (Galatians 1:10). Explain Paul's words.
4. Galatians 2:21 records the following words of Paul, "I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through the Law, Christ died for nothing!" When might those who have received God's grace find themselves guilty of setting "aside the grace of God"?
5. Describe the unity enjoyed by all who have been baptized into Christ and have clothed themselves with Christ (Galatians 3:26-29).
6. Review Galatians 4:4-9. God sent His only Son into the world to free us from slavery to sin. Yet even though we are free, we still sometimes find ourselves drawn to certain aspects of our slavery. Explain.
7. Galatians 5:19-26 juxtaposes two worldviews. Describe the evidence of life lived according to the sinful nature and life lived according to the spirit. What dangers does Paul warn about in verses 25 and 26?
8. Explain the positive and negative applications of reaping and sowing. Explained in Galatians 6:8. What positive seeds do you plan to sow today? What negative will you God's Spirit to enable you to ignore?
