

READ THROUGH THE BIBLE SCHEDULE FOR 6/4/12 TO 6/10/12

MONDAY, JUNE 4, 2012 Read Exodus 34:1-35

The Lord reveals His glory to Moses (vv. 5-7), just as He had promised (33:18-23). HE also renews the covenant promises He had made before the people's sin with the golden calf. When Moses returns to the camp, his face glows- he reflects the glory of the Lord!

TUESDAY, JUNE 5, 2012 Read Exodus 35:1 to 36:38

Forgiven and restored, Israel sets out with renewed zeal to build the tabernacle. The people offer not only their possessions, but themselves and their personal talents and abilities to the Lord.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 6, 2012 Read Exodus 37:1 to 38:31

These chapters continue the recorded of the careful way God's people followed the pattern He had given Moses as they constructed the tabernacle. The description concludes with an inventory of the vast wealth that went into the construction (38:21-31).

THURSDAY, JUNE 7, 2012 Read Exodus 39:1 to 40:38

Today's reading begins with a description of the clothing the people furnished for the priests. Each article was made just as the Lord had commanded Moses earlier (Exodus 28). The reading then closes with Moses "inspection tour" of the completed tabernacle furnishings. Having approved the work, Moses blessed the people and led them in dedicating their place of public worship.

FRIDAY, JUNE 8, 2012 Read Leviticus 1:1-17

As you read Leviticus 1 and the chapters that follow, keep in mind the purpose behind all the rituals the Lord gave His people. He used these "visual aids" to make the people aware of the destructive nature of sin and to point them toward the coming Savior who would die in their place. As you read today, ask yourself, "What picture of Christ does the burnt offering of Leviticus 1 paint?" Hint: Circle the word *all* in 1:9 and 1:13.

SATURDAY, JUNE 9, 2012 Read Leviticus 2:1 to 3:17

Today you will read about the grain offering. The Hebrew word that identifies this offering can also refer to tribute money paid to a conquering king as a show of loyalty. This word, perhaps then, hints at what the sacrifice meant. You will also read about the peace offering. It was optional and could be brought in thanksgiving (7:12), to fulfill a vow (7:16), or, possibly, as a confession of sin. As you read, note the role played by the worshiper and that by the priest in each offering.
