

READ THROUGH THE BIBLE SCHEDULE FOR 02/04/13 TO 02/11/13

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 2013 Read Job 32 to 34

Until now, Elihu, Job's fourth comforter, has kept quiet. But at this point, he speaks up. As you read, see if you can spot ways his approach differs from that of his three friends who first spoke to Job.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 5, 2013 Read Job 35 to 37

Elihu continues, painting a picture of our Lord and of his dealings with us as you read, note the aspects of God's character that Elihu highlights.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 2013 Read Job 38 to 41

Throughout the book, Job has longed for his "day in court." He is about to get his hearing! As you read, look for evidence of the Lord's wisdom, peace, and authority.

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2013 Read Job 42

Maybe you know the old story about the Sunday school teacher who polled her class for favorite bible verses. One little girl, steeped in the King James version, answered, "It came to pass." Her text was out of context, to be sure, but comforting nevertheless. Pain and grief will come, but sooner or later, in God's mercy, they will pass. Today you will read the end of Job's story. As you do, note how Job's trials "came to pass."

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2013 Read Psalms 1 to 6.

The book of Psalms deals with nearly every emotion known to human beings. Anger. Disappointment. Delight. Peace. Trouble. Trust. Fear. Seldom does the psalmist give specific details about his situation or problem. Because this is so, we can use the words of the psalmist as we lift our own situations and problems to our Lord in prayer. With this in mind, don't simply *read* today's psalms, *pray* them, especially Psalms 4-6.

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 2013 Read Psalms 7 to 11

In Psalms 7,9 and 10, the psalmist asks God for the same kind of justice- the vindication- for which Job prayed, Psalm 8 is a song of praise to the Lord of creation who silences His enemies. As you pray the these psalms, do so with an eye toward the schemes Satan still hatches against Christ's people, Christ's church.
